Big Basswood Lake Association Board Meeting-June 15, 2012

Old Business:

Topics for the Spring/Summer Newsletter were requested. Lolly volunteered to review the Round Barn activities. Marilyn will check with year-around residents to review ice patterns on the lake. Also, Marilyn will get local farmers' market information for the newsletter. The Canadian Dog Trials will be held in the area in September and Mike and Lolly will get that information. Marilyn will also encourage members to participate in the Wildlife and Habitat Survey. Mike would like the newsletter content ASAP.

Peter raised concerns about septic testing on the lake. Some testing has occurred but it is not clear what follow-up, if any, has taken place. BBLA membership has consistently noted water quality has the main issue of concern. Mike will contact the Algoma Health Unit for an update on the testing process on Big basswood Lake and share the information at the AGM.
